CBOQ Next Generation Ministry (CBOQ Next Gen) exists to serve God by mobilizing and developing frontline ministry workers and churches across Ontario and Quebec, alongside Christian Youth and Family Agencies, in effectively engaging kids and youth with the person and message of Jesus, and empower them in their journey towards being fully-committed Christ-Followers. We focus our mission through 4 key themes:

How does CBOQ Next Gen fulfill it's mandate? Through our C.R.E.A.T.E. strategy.



C is for Coaching and Consultation: Meeting with ministry leaders or churches to discuss a variety of children, youth and family ministry issues, from ministry strategic planning to "how do I handle this?" to sensitive issues and conflict resolution.



R is for Resources: Offering a plethora of resources to support frontline ministry to kids, youth & family (whether electronically, in print or through partnerships).



E is for Empowerment: Creating practical and hands-on opportunities for kids, youth, families and leaders to be involved in Kingdom focused ways beyond what the local church can do.



A is for Advocacy and Research: Together, building awareness and giving children and youth ministries a voice in our churches whether locally, regionally or nationally.



T is for Training: Providing, creating or partnering with agencies to offer high quality professional development through workshops, webinars and conferences.



E is for Experiences: Hosting large-scale opportunities that capitalizes on the strength of bringing a wider audience of people together for the purpose of spiritual life-change and growth, supplementing the work of the local church.

coaching + consultation

WHY DO WE DO IT?

Every ministry setting is different. While there are some common elements between ministries, how they apply and how they are implemented may be different.

With CBOQ Next Gen, one of our primary services that we offer to our churches and leaders is coaching and consulting. We believe it's vital to hear your story and context. It is through the process of helping you ask the right questions, developing a clearer picture of your ministry, having a better understanding of your context along with prayerful discernment, that we seek to help you take the next steps in where God is leading your ministry. This could be done with you individually, with your ministry team or a larger group (including your senior church leadership). From there, we'll help tailor a plan that makes sense for your context.

We also believe in being available as one of your support networks. Whether you have a question about ministry or other areas of life, we're one channel you can turn to.

- Meeting with you individually.
- Using tools like Ministry Audits to decipher your context.
- Connecting you with other ministry experts in a particular field (as applicable).
- Be available for both professional and personal coaching.

WHY DO WE DO IT?

While we know you can create great resources, none of us can do it all by ourselves. We want to provide you with resources to build up your ministry with children, youth and families that we have specifically created for our CBOQ churches. We also curate other effective resources from credible ministries for you to consider. Quality resources are an effective tool in creating an environment of faith formation and spiritual growth.

- CBOQ-created electronic and print materials: Transitions 2.0, bridge docs, curriculum, Take Out Church, Reel Family Time discussion starters, etc.
- Resource highlights shared via social media: Facebook, Instagram, Pinterest, YouTube, Spotify
- Curriculum and Resource reviews and recommendation lists recommended from other ministries

WHY WE DO IT?

Since creation, God has invited humanity to participate in his on-going creative work and mission. He entrusts us with responsibilities which He could easily handle, yet has empowered us to join with Him to carry out. This was modelled through Jesus to his disciples and those part of the growing movement (i.e. the church.)

CBOQ Next Gen aims to provide meaningful spaces and experiences for the next generation to take on leadership opportunities to significantly contribute in God's on-going kingdom work. This isn't to replace what you're already doing in your ministry; it's to supplement and galvanize resources that you may not be able to do on your own.

- Short term leadership opportunities like the Slingshot program (both locally and across Canada)
- Compassion experiences both locally and overseas
- Extended learning opportunities (i.e. Kwasind's Leaders In Training program)
- Camp Kwasind Summer Staff Team/GameChanger
- Young Leaders Collective

advocacy + research

WHY DO WE DO IT?

Together with you, we want to build awareness and give children, youth and their families a voice in our churches. Part of the role of CBOQ Next Gen is to be a supportive outside voice to advocate for the ministry work you are doing in your church and local community. There may be ways that we can come alongside you or advocate for new initiatives you are embarking on. We can also bring you the latest research and insights on children, family, youth culture and ministry trends.

- An annual Next Steps survey sent to ministry leaders to share upcoming goals and give feedback on CBOQ Next Gen resources
- Collecting data and researching trends among our churches
- Participating with our Canadian Baptist partners for a national voice on Next Generation ministry
- Participating on research and data collection with other ministry organizations
- Researching and sharing findings on current trends and issues related to Next Generation ministry

WHY DO WE DO IT?

It is vital to have on-going professional development for ministry leaders (whether volunteer or paid) and churches to grow in ministry effectiveness by learning and sharpening skills. This growth happens by participating in high quality training opportunities, hosted by CBOQ or another trusted ministry partner.


experiences

WHY DO WE DO THIS?

Experiences are memorable milestones, serving as rites of passage in a person's faith journey. They are moments we look back to and remember as significant marker in our walk with Jesus. Research (e.g. Hemorrhaging Faith, Renegotiating Faith) reinforces the long term faith development value that occurs through experiences such as weekend retreats, mission trips and camps. While we recognize events are not ministry in and of itself, yet they provide the framework to facilitate spaces for faith dialogue and extended moments of reflection to happen.

We believe experiences that happen outside of the "routine" help catalyze those faith moments.

- Hosting weekend retreats (e.g. Avalanche, Blizzard)
- Organizing outreach opportunities that may not be possible for one church to do (e.g. Raptors 905 Faith and Family, Centre Court with the Raptors)
- Summer camp and leadership programs
- Compassion experiences (aka: short-term mission trips)
- Camp Kwasind Spring and Fall outdoor retreats





how the three work together



A

- Oversee a strategy in mobilizing and developing ministry leaders of various ages as they reach out and disciple the upcoming generation in engaging with the person and message of Jesus
- Primary agent in other church-wide engagements (e.g. boards, senior pastors, etc.)
- Importance of modelling the collaborative value of cross departmental/ministry work that strengthens all areas of ministry with a shared mission and vision
- Between these three departments, we aim to create smooth transitions for young people towards serving, growing and leading as adults in church life

B

- Bridge campers and their families into the local church ministries and faith community
- Christian kids (church) being able to invite their friends who are on their way to God to experience the message of Jesus in a non-threatening environment (camp)
- Some leadership development transfers to church campers

C

- External leadership development supplement for youth as camp staff, LIT
- External leadership supplement for camp staff in CBOQ-wide events (e.g. retreats), collaborative Compassion Experiences, other church-based opportunities

- Facilitate the transition between children's ministry and youth ministry
- Integrate overarching parent ministry and resources
- Continuity of ministry philosophy within ministries ages 0-25
- Be a bridge in leadership development


- Outreach and foundational faith development opportunities in a naturalistic environment
- Interact and build faith community with kids, youth and families from a variety of Christian denominational backgrounds

- Venue for churches to use as external location (e.g. weekend rental)
