# Week One of Advent - December 3

Sermon Title: "My Messiah" is Immanuel

Passage: Isaiah 7:14 (could also integrate Matthew 1:22-23)

## **Ideas and Concepts:**

- Introduce the idea of the Messiah being the one that people longed for – a coming Saviour
- This Messiah would be "God with us"
- Discuss what it means for God to be with us and the significance of the incarnation (John 1)
- What does it mean for us today to remember our Messiah is STILL "God with us?"
- What comfort and hope does this bring to our world and to you?

# Week Two of Advent - December 10

Sermon Title: "My Messiah" is a Man of Sorrows

Passage: Isaiah 53: 1-6

## **Ideas and Concepts:**

- Exploring the idea of Jesus as a "suffering servant"
- Can use other passages that point to Jesus suffering in Scripture and ways He suffered for us
- What does it mean for us to remember our Messiah is a Man of Sorrows? What comfort does it bring you in your suffering to remember that Jesus understands our suffering?
- How do we share in the suffering of others, as Jesus did?



# Week Three of Advent - December 17

Sermon Title: "My Messiah" is Prince of Peace

Passages: Isaiah 9:6, Luke 2: 14, John 14: 27

### Ideas and Concepts:

- Jesus came not as a military ruler but as a Prince of Peace
- Jesus said "blessed are the peacemakers"
- What does peace look like for us in our world?
- How do we live the way of Jesus, who is Prince of Peace, in our time, especially in this season of war?
- Where do you need to seek the way of peace in your life with your own family, friends and community? Are there people with whom you must seek peace? How can Jesus help you?

# Week Four of Advent - December 24

Sermon Title: "My Messiah came for me."

**Scripture:** The Christmas Story

# Ideas and Concepts:

- Summarize series: We were told in the prophets that Jesus would be Immanuel, Man of Sorrows, Prince of Peace
- How do we see this reality in the way that He was born?
- What does the story of Christmas tell us about our amazing Messiah?
- If you haven't yet, will you make Jesus your Messiah this Christmas season? Can you say that Jesus is indeed "My Messiah?"
